# **PVSS Bylaws Revisions**

In an effort to meet the growing presence of the PVSS as the voice for young vascular surgeons and increasing interest among our membership in participation in the society, the Executive Council met several times last year to re-format the society's executive infrastructure. Several bylaws changes were approved at the PVSS Member Business meeting in June 2009 (complete bylaws are posted online http://www.pvss.org/bylaws.htm). A few high points are outlined:

### 1) Expansion of Endovascular Therapies:

[Article II – Objectives, Sections a and b] The mission of the society was changed to include "vascular surgery and endovascular therapies."


- 2) More Involvement of Young Vascular Surgeons: [Article II Objectives, Sections d] A new section has been added: "To provide a forum for the young vascular surgeon (active members, see Article IV) to promote the field of vascular and endovascular surgery through education, scholarship, advocacy, and leadership." In addition, the creation of a new Vascular Residency Issues Committee will address issues important to vascular surgeons early in their careers.
- 3) Extended Time of Active Membership:

[Article IV – Membership, section 3] The duration of active membership was extended from 12 years previously to 15 years.

- 4) Additional Committee Participation Opportunity: [Article VIII Committees and Representatives] The previous PVSS committee infrastructure was reorganized to include Nominating, Program, Scholarship, Fundraising, Bylaws, Membership, and Communications committees. Additional ad hoc communities including the Military Liaison and Vascular Residency Issues committees were created. The opportunity for participation in administrative function and leadership opportunities for our members has nearly doubled.
- 5) PVSS Administrative Infrastructure:

Reflected in the Bylaws changes, the new administrative hierarchy of the PVSS is outlined in the flow chart below.

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# **Grants & Scholarships**

### PVSS Announces the 2010 Faculty Research Award

Since 1994, the PVSS has awarded promising young vascular surgeons the Faculty Research Award to help stimulate their early academic careers. Previous recipients, including Julie Freischlag, William Suggs, Vivian Gahtan, and Paul Gagne to name a few, went on to very successful academic careers in Vascular Surgery. More recent recipients like Alan Dardik, Brian Nolan, Philip Goodney, and Matthew Corriere are currently on the fast track to success.

This year's 2010 award is now open for application. The details of the grant and the application process can be found on the PVSS website (<a href="http://www.pvss.org/grant.htm">http://www.pvss.org/grant.htm</a>). Briefly, it consists of a 9-page research proposal, along with a cover letter, your biosketch, a budget proposal with justification, and other support materials. The award is \$14,500 to be applied entirely to the resources required for the research proposed. There is no faculty salary support or indirect funding available. Research in any discipline – i.e. basic science, translational research, clinical outcomes, or education – are eligible and will be considered. The importance of this award to the applicant's career goals must be clearly spelled out in the cover letter.
