VESS Spring Meeting Re-Cap

Another successful VESS Spring Meeting was held on May 31, 2017 at the San Diego Convention Center. Our Spring meeting was held in conjunction with the Society for Vascular Surgery VAM2017. The timeline of sessions was coordinated to minimize topic overlap with SVS Postgraduate courses running concurrently and attendance was great – 125 - 150 attendees throughout the day. We hope you all were able to participate.

We want to congratulate the VESS Spring Program Committee led by **Dr. Bernadette Aulivola (Chair)**, and including **Drs. Katherine Gallagher, Niten Singh, Jeffrey Siracuse, Ravi Rajani, Matthew Smeds, and Misty Humphries**. They worked with the SVS/VESS Joint Program Committee to select a spectacular line-up of papers for our session.

A Total of **717 submissions: 667 abstracts, and 50 videos** were reviewed (versus 626 abstracts submitted in 2016). **Thirty (30) abstracts** were selected for the VESS Spring Program, and included presentations on Aortic, Cerebrovascular, Complications, Dialysis, Peripheral Arterial Disease, Practice Management, Vascular Lab/Imaging and Venous Disease topics.

Once again, VESS Candidate Members were featured as invited discussants for each paper. The response to the call for discussants was overwhelming with more than 20 names on a waiting list. Manuscripts given prior to the meeting provided overviews of the material to be presented in context with the literature allowing the Candidate Members to frame their discussion with thoughtful and insightful questions for the authors. This long-standing VESS tradition of inviting young residents and fellows to be primary discussants during a national meeting is a unique opportunity that many have not experienced before.


VESS 2018 Early Career Faculty Research Award

VESS NEXT GENERATION Student Program

At this year's VESS Annual Meeting in Vail, we have added an exciting program entitled "**The Next Generation**" focused on providing medical students with a career interest in vascular surgery a forum to see what we are all about. There will be dedicated programming aimed at their needs, overlap programming with the fellows program so that they can engage current trainees, and ample time for them to meet VESS members who might offer them mentorship.

VESS, in collaboration with the Foundation for Vascular Innovation (FVI) will be providing **\$1,000 scholarships** to 10 – 20 medical students representing medical and osteopathic schools around the country.
